Several remained geologists and explored in Central and South America, Europe and the Middle East. Bill Rogers was headed off to Saudi Arabia in 1953. Bill Peabody worked with Amoco and later with classmate **Louis Marx's** offshore oil ventures. Eileen Schoellkopf wrote from Pasadena that Fred has dementia but is well cared for. Hostetler recently checked in from Macquarie University in New South Wales, Australia (about as far as you can get from Princeton) where he has been on the earth sciences faculty for ten plus years. Previously he owned a groundwater search business in Northern Ontario. He could win the long distance prize at our 65th!

Jim Saffery informed us of the death of **Robert Wei** of Nazareth, PA in late September. Bob was a long-time professor at Lehigh. A memorial service was held in Bethlehem on October 24. Ellen Dunham-Jones '80 *83 informed us of the death on September 26 of her father **E. Alden Dunham** from the effects of Parkinson's Disease and complications following a fall while playing tennis.
