

**Carl Stanton Stevenson, Jr.**, who died on September 28, 2018, was born in Toronto, Canada, and came to Princeton from Upper Canada College. He majored in the School of Public and International Affairs, was business editor of the Daily Princetonian, and a member of Quadrangle Club. Stan left Princeton after his Junior year to return to Canada and graduate from Trinity College of the University of Toronto. He then earned a degree in law from Osgoode Hall Law School of York University in Toronto. He also did summer stints in the reserves of both the American and Canadian Navies. Stan practiced law as a partner or associate of Owen, Dickey Stevenson (Barrie), Ivey and Dowler, Stevenson, Evans, and Polishuk (London), Blake Cassels & Graydon (Toronto), and Ontario Hydro (Assistant Secretary). He specialized in construction, engineering, and municipal law and received his Queen's Counsel appointment in 1974. Over the years, he served as Chair of the London Motor Club, and worked as a volunteer for the Children's Hospital of Western Ontario and the Metropolitan Ontario Boys and Girls Club. He was also an active member of the Kiwanis Club in several cities. Stan is survived by his second wife, Louise Dawson, five children, two step-children, and ten grandchildren.
