Clarke was born in Daytona Beach, Florida, and came to Princeton from Phillips Academy. He majored in Chemistry, was a member of Campus Club, and played IAA football. After graduation, Clarke was drafted and spent his army stint at Fort Monmouth, learning and teaching the guidance system of the NIKE guided missile. A chemist who specialized in marketing research, Clarke worked for the Atlas Powder Company, later the Astra Zeneca Corporation, traveling widely and speaking often at industry gatherings and serving as president of the Chemical Marketing Research Association. In retirement Clarke worked on a number of Earthwatch archeological projects in such places as Moscow, Pompeii, and Mammoth Cave and volunteered at Wilmington's Faith Center which provided counseling and financial assistance to low-income families and individuals facing immediate financial crises.
