

Robert Geoffrey Neville was born in Bethlehem, PA, and came to Princeton from Liberty High School. He majored in chemistry and was a member of Quadrangle Club. After Princeton, Jeff spent three years in the U S Navy and then earned an MBA from Harvard Business School. He was a partner in his first business venture, Shield Packaging Corporation, and then was the founder of Concord Foods, a growing, mid-sized food manufacturer located in Brockton, MA. After retiring, Jeff became involved in the Executive Service Corps helping nonprofit organizations with strategic planning, board development, and fund raising. Working with USAID, Jeff traveled to a number of countries in the former Soviet Union, Africa, Asia, and Central America. He died on September 30, 2017 after a long battle with ALS (Lou Gehrig's Disease). Jeff is survived by his wife, Yajaira; his sons, Geoffrey Neville Jr. and Peter Neville; step daughter Arcelia Pena and 6 grandchildren.
